Indonesia Story

The Muslim fasting month (from February 19 to March 19 for 30 days) has begun. During this period, Muslims fast from food and water while the sun is up, and they spend the time seeking purification by keeping a right heart and practicing good deeds. They wake up at 3 am, have their first meal before 4 am, and then begin their fast. At 5 am, they gather at the mosque for prayer and recitation. Later in the evening, when the call to break the fast echoes from the mosque around 6:30 pm, they share their evening meal. At night, they gather again at the mosque for recitation and study of the Quran.

One Muslim friend told us that during Ramadan, it is actually more difficult to behave kindly and guard one's heart from evil thoughts than simply to fast. Yet he said with tears in his eyes that he is grateful for the opportunity to become purified before Allah.

For many Muslims, participating in the fast is also a matter of pride.

After Ramadan, from March 20 to 24, there is a five-day official holiday called Eid al-Fitr. During this celebration, people greet one another with the words "Mohon maaf lahir dan batin," which means, "Please forgive me for any wrong I have done, outwardly or inwardly." After reflecting on themselves during Ramadan, they use this time to forgive one another and renew their relationships.

Please pray that Muslims who faithfully keep the five daily prayers and the month-long fast each year would be set free from empty religious practices and come to receive Jesus Christ, the only name that brings salvation.

Through your prayers and God's grace, we have begun a new after-school study ministry in a new location. Two mothers from the village are teaching elementary students math and Indonesian, and missionary Linji Choi is teaching English to the middle school students. Currently, 27 elementary students and 11 middle school students are studying in the program.

The renovations have not progressed as quickly as we expected and are still ongoing. However, one room has been completed, and we are using that space to teach the children. Sometimes we feel frustrated, thinking that the work would already be finished if we were in Korea, but we remind ourselves that this may simply be the Sundanese way of doing things and try to keep our hearts patient.

All the students who attend the English class are middle school students, yet many of them still find it difficult even to give basic greetings or to read in English. Because the level of public education is quite low, this is common among children in rural Indonesia. Even so, they learn with such bright eyes and joyful hearts that we eagerly look forward to meeting them each time.

Whenever we arrive in the village, before getting out of the car, we pray aloud for the children in the study program and for the people of the village. Please pray with us that through this study ministry in this 100% Muslim village, the children will not only receive education but also experience the love of Jesus Christ. Pray that this study center will become a bridge that opens opportunities for the gospel to be shared.





Once a month, we gather for worship with Sundanese people who are Muslim-background believers and with Muslims who are interested in Christianity. Among them, we have begun discipling one family with the hope of raising them up as leaders.

The husband shared that when he was young, he believed in Jesus because his grandfather was a house church leader. However, after his grandfather passed away, he lost his faith and lived neither as a Muslim nor as a Christian. Later, through our gathering, he decided once again to believe in and follow Jesus.

His wife, who had been a Muslim, also said that she would receive Jesus and place her faith in Him. When the brother shared with gratitude that the legacy of faith from his grandfather was continuing once again, we also gave thanks to God together with him.

We visit this family every week for Bible study. Thankfully, not only the couple we initially intended

to disciple, but also another young couple and a divorced mother—who is still Muslim but said she would like to study the Bible—along with her eldest daughter, have begun attending the gathering.

Each week we give them a Scripture memorization assignment. At first, no one memorized the verses, but last week everyone faithfully memorized all five verses. We were deeply moved by their effort. We are also memorizing the verses diligently each week. ^^

All of them are poor Muslims, and there are many ways in which they need help. These days, we often find ourselves asking, "What would Jesus do?"

Please pray for this group, where some have weak faith and others still stand with one foot in Islam and one in Christianity. Pray that as they memorize Scripture, they will experience the work of Jesus Christ, who is the Word.
